

Site Specific Requirements for Imported Materials

Dear Valued Customer,

Work sites are being increasingly subject to environmental compliance regulations such as Remedial Action Plans (RAP), and restrictions on the importation and use of recycled products. This is typically due to pre-existing site contamination or a negative experience on a previous project.

Benedict would like to respectfully advise our customers that it's your responsibility to fully inform us at the time of quoting of any project-specific conditions, including but not limited to, a site controlled by an EPA Site Auditor, a Remediation Action Plan, or any other site-specific requirement that may impact on the importation of materials to your project.

Most RAP place restrictions and requirements on the importation of materials. It is common practice for a RAP to request that all imported materials are to be tested for the site-specific criteria **before** being imported to site. Since this type of testing is project-specific, and is not part of our quality control testing, it is the customer's responsibility to ensure that **any contamination testing, if required, is to be carried out at the quarry where the proposed material is produced and stockpiled, ready for dispatch to the site.**

Benedict has been offering the service of product testing and pre-approval at the quarry source for many years and are happy to assist you to meet your specific site compliance requirements. **To arrange your testing and/or stockpile inspection, please contact your Benedict Sales Representative in writing at least 2 days in advance.** After the testing has been completed and the material has been approved by the customer, a purchase order is required before any material can be ex-binned or delivered from our quarries to site.

Please Note: Benedict Pty Ltd does not accept any liability regarding contamination of our materials once they have been delivered to site, as we cannot control the environment that our material is placed in. The costs associated with the rejection of any Benedict products delivered to site, due to a failure to meet project-specific environmental compliance standards will be borne by the customer.
